2023/03	 CIr Huffer has been working with CIr Gwilym Butler regarding the road Closure on the A4117 from Cleobury Mortimer to Lem for the resurfacing works in October, which will cause distruption for commuters to the West Midlands. The Appeal has been submitted for the Ledwyche Solar Farm application and will be by written representations. There is no update from Shropshire Council on the timescales for the work to be done to Bitterley Bridge to rectify the damage done when a vehicle went through the wall after leaving the point to point, there is stonework that has ended up halfway in the brook. CIr Huffer asked if the PC wanted to write a letter to the Point to Point Committee as a number of residents want to bring to the attention of the Parish Council the parking on the verges, the soil has made it difficult to drive down the road, the under age drinking, and the mess it has genrlly caused in the village. It was Proposed by CIr Osborne and 2nd by CIr Holman that a letter be written to the Point to Point Committee, all agreed. CIr Osborne and CIr Wheeler to draft a letter. 1. Regarding a question at a previous meeting the clerk confirmed that the way for jobs to be prioritised is for them to be reported on "Fixmystreet". This is used by Shropshire Council to report on the frequency that repairs are made in specific areas. If there are repeat offending areas Technicians will go to inspect to see if it is more cost effective to raise a capital scheme, to stop repeated works.

Mr Clayton was asked about clearing the Gully at Ledwyche but there is not one there and the Parish Council would need to ask Shropshire Highways for one to be installed unless Bitterley Parish want to fund this but would need the permission first. It was agreed by Councillors not to persue that at this time.

2023/11	Brown Clee Medical practice 1. The medium to long term provision of GP services within the Brown Clee Medical Practice area is currently uncertain. Dr Railton has announced her intention to retire from the partnership at the end of 2023 and Dr. Bassett by the end of 2027. There is a known shortage of GP's wishing to locate to rural communities therefore recruitment to our area to replace them is expected to be difficult. It was proposed by the Partners that a community led buy-out of the premises, removing the need for new partners to buy into the equity, might assist in attracting GP's to the Practice. To advance this idea, an unincorporated community group has been formed comprising patients of the Practice. A Committee has been established from members of this group and a constitution adopted. The purpose of the Group is as follows: 1. To support the ongoing provision of the Brown Clee Medical Practice 2. To assess the feasibility, and support the acquisition of, the surgery buildings currently owned by the Brown Clee Medical Practice in Stottesden and Ditton Priors by the community and individuals served by the Practice. 3. To work with the BCMP Partners and Medical Practice, Patient Participation Group (PPG), the NHS and associated bodies and other community groups in support of this purpose.
